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# **BOARD OF DIRECTORS**

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# SUMMARY OF ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENTS

Real GDP at market prices grew by 7.0 percent in 2013, compared to 6.9 percent recorded in 2012, with growth accelerating in communications, trade and repairs, and hotels and restaurants activities. Annual headline inflation increased to an average of 6.4 percent in the quarter ending June 2014 compared to 6.0 percent recorded in the preceding quarter, mainly due to an increase in prices of food and non-alcoholic beverages.

Extended broad money supply (M3) grew by 15.8 percent compared with 14.9 percent in the year ending June 2013. This development is explained by increase in credit to the private sector and net foreign assets of the banking system. Meanwhile, the spread between the 12-months deposit rate and one-year lending rate widened to 3.59 percentage points in the quarter ending June 2014.

Government budgetary operations (on cheque issued basis) were characterized by good domestic revenue collection coupled with moderate expenditure. Domestic revenue collections by the Central Government were 88.4 percent of the target for the quarter ending March 2014. Total external debt stock increased by USD 556.1 million to USD 14,021.2 million from the amount recorded in the quarter ending March 2014. The increase was mainly on account of new disbursements and accumulation of interest arrears. Total domestic debt stock increased by TZS 41.0 billion to TZS 6,535.4 billion from the amount recorded in the previous quarter, on account of issuance of Government securities that outweighed maturing obligations.

During the quarter ending June 2014, current account deficit narrowed to USD 1,174.7 million from USD 1,185.4 million recorded in the corresponding quarter in 2013 due to increase in exports of goods that outweighed the impact of goods import.

Real GDP for Zanzibar is estimated to have grown by 7.3 percent during the quarter ending March 2014, from 6.8 percent recorded in the corresponding period in 2013. Activities that contributed to the growth include hotel and restaurants; and transport and communication sectors. Headline inflation increased to an average of 6.8 percent, from 4.8 percent recorded during the corresponding quarter in 2013, largely driven by the prices of fish and banana; and items under communications, education, recreation and culture subgroups. Government

budgetary operations registered a deficit of TZS 13.5 billion after grants and adjustment to cash. Development expenditure was below the estimates for the quarter by 61.5 percent, on account of delayed disbursement of donor funds. The current account deficit improved to USD 16.7 million in the quarter ending June 2014 from USD 18.7 million recorded in the preceding quarter, mainly on account of decrease in imports of goods and services.

In the East African Community, headline inflation declined to an average of 5.0 percent from 5.8 percent registered in the preceding quarter. This development was largely driven by the fall in prices of food, transport and housing. In the Southern African Development Community, average inflation rate remained at 6.2 percent, same as recorded in the previous quarter.

# **1.0 OUTPUT AND PRICES**

### **Overall Economic Performance**

Real GDP at market prices grew by 7.0 percent in 2013, compared to 6.9 percent recorded in 2012. Growth accelerated in communications which registered a growth rate of 22.8 percent, trade and repairs (8.3 percent) and hotels and restaurants (6.3 percent) activities.

### **Sectoral Performance**

## **Procurement of Traditional Export Crops**

During the quarter ending June 2014, procurement of major traditional export crops declined to 54,193.4 tonnes from 88,999.1 tonnes recorded in corresponding period in 2013, mainly due to shortfall in procurement of tobacco (**Table 1.1**). Contrary to the decline in total procurement of export crops there was an increase in procurement of tea, associated with good weather in the tea growing areas.

## **Production of Gold and Diamond**

Production of gold and diamond by large scale mining companies declined during the quarter ending June 2014. A total of 7,403.0 kilograms of gold worth USD 246.7 million was produced compared to 9,221.2 kilograms worth USD 428.0 million recorded in the corresponding quarter in 2013. The volume of gold produced during the review period declined due to closure of two mining companies while decline in the value of gold was also explained by a fall in price of gold in the world market (**Table 1.2**).

#### **Food Reserve Situation**

Food supply situation in the country remained satisfactory with some pockets of food shortages reported. During the period under review, the National Food Reserve Agency (NFRA) purchased 7.8 tonnes of sorghum and sold 9,986.3 tonnes of maize. The agency sold 1,608.5 tonnes to Prison Department, 5,088.8 tonnes to Disaster Coordination Unit under the Prime Minister's Office and 3,288.0 tonnes to World Food Programme. The stock of maize and sorghum held by NFRA decreased to 189,494 tonnes as at the end of June 2014 compared to 27,494 tonnes recorded at the corresponding period in June 2013 (**Table 1.3**).

When compared to the previous quarter, wholesale prices for all selected food crops decreased, with exception of rice and beans. However, when compared with the

corresponding quarter in 2013, prices of rice and maize decreased mainly due to higher crop harvests (**Table 1.4**).

# **Inflation Developments**

Headline inflation increased to an average of 6.4 percent in the quarter ending June 2014 compared to 6.0 percent recorded in the preceding quarter, mainly driven by an increase in prices of food and non-alcoholic beverages. However, the headline inflation was lower than 8.4 percent recorded in the corresponding quarter in 2013. Food and non-alcoholic beverages inflation rose to an average of 8.1 percent, from 6.5 percent recorded in the previous quarter. During the period, non-food inflation decreased to 4.6 percent, from an average of 6.0 percent (**Chart 1.1 and Table 1.5**).




Chart 1.1: Annual Headline, Food and Non-food Inflation

# 2.0 MONETARY AND FINANCIAL DEVELOPMENTS

# **Money and Credit**

During the year ending June 2014, extended broad money supply (M3) grew by 15.8 percent compared with 14.9 percent recorded in the year ending June 2013. The growth of money supply was largely driven by increase in credit to the private sector and Net Foreign Assets (NFA) of the banking system. During the period, credit to the private sector grew by 21.4 percent compared with 17.1 percent recorded in the year ending June 2013. The NFA of the banking system increased by TZS 556.5 billion compared with an increase of TZS 186.0 billion recorded in the year ending June 2013 (**Chart 2.1** and **Table 2.1**).




Chart 2.1: Annual Growth Rates of Monetary Aggregates and its Components

The growth of credit to most of the major economic activities was higher in the year to June 2014 compared with growth rates recorded in the year to June 2013. During the period, credit to transport and communication activities recorded the highest annual growth followed by manufacturing activity (**Chart 2.2**). However, annual growth of credit extended to agriculture and building and construction activities exhibited a decreasing trend, but remained higher than growth rates recorded in March 2014. During the period, the large portion of total outstanding credit continued to be held in trade, personal and manufacturing activities (**Chart 2.3**).




Chart 2.2: Annual Growth of Commercial Banks' Credit to Selected Economics Activities




Chart 2.3: Share of Commercial Banks' Outstanding Credit to Selected Economic Activities

#### **Interest Rates Developments**

During the quarter ending June 2014, commercial banks' interest rates exhibited a general declining trend. Overall deposit rate decreased to an average of 8.51 percent compared to 8.72 percent recorded in the quarter ending March 2014, and 8.88 percent recorded in corresponding quarter in 2013. The 12 months deposit rate also decreased marginally to an average of 11.08 percent from 11.25 percent recorded in the preceding quarter, and 11.57 percent registered in similar period 2013.

In the same period, the overall lending rate decreased to 16.38 percent, compared to 16.47 percent registered in the preceding quarter, but was higher than 15.84 percent registered in the corresponding quarter of 2013. Similarly, one-year lending rate averaged at 14.67 percent down from 14.75 percent recorded in the quarter ending March 2014, but slightly higher than 14.36 percent recorded in the similar quarter in 2013. Following these developments, the spread between the 12-months deposit rate and one-year lending rate widened to 3.59 percentage points in the quarter ending June 2014 (**Table 2.2**).



#### **Financial Market Operations**

During the quarter ending June 2014, the Bank offered Treasury bills worth TZS 810.0 billion, which was higher compared with TZS 765.0 billion offered in the preceding quarter, but similar to the amount offered in the corresponding quarter in 2013. Demand amounted to TZS 1,415.9 billion and the Bank accepted bids worth TZS 906.6 billion. Following high

demand, the overall Weighted Average Yield (WAY) decreased to an average of 12.80 percent from 13.82 percent recorded in the preceding quarter and 13.81 percent recorded in the corresponding quarter in 2013 (**Chart 2.4**).

The Bank offered Treasury bonds of different maturities amounting to TZS 246.8 billion in the quarter ending June 2014 compared with TZS 196.2 billion and TZS 295.0 billion offered in the quarter ending March 2014 and June 2013, respectively. Total demand amounted to TZS 407.5 billion and the Bank accepted bids worth TZS 251.1 billion.

The value of transactions in the interbank cash market amounted to TZS 3,419.9 billion compared with TZS 2,586.7 billion for the preceding quarter, and TZS 2,361.3 billion recorded in the quarter ending June 2013. Overnight placements continued to account for the largest share of total transactions (by 81.8 percent). Meanwhile overnight interbank rate rose to an average of 8.10 percent from 7.80 percent recorded in the preceding quarter but declined from 8.86 percent recorded in the corresponding period in 2013 (**Chart 2.5**).





Chart 2.5: Inter-bank Cash Market Developments


During the quarter ending June 2014, the sale of repurchase agreements (repo) decreased when compared with sales recorded in the preceding quarter and the corresponding quarter in 2013. The Bank conducted repos with commercial banks amounting to TZS 149.0 billion, down from TZS 490.0 billion traded in the quarter ending March 2014 and TZS 375.0 billion recorded in the quarter ending June 2013. Meanwhile, repo rate declined to an average of 3.96 percent from 4.36 percent registered in the preceding quarter, but was higher than 3.62 percent registered in the quarter ending June 2013 (**Chart 2.6**).

During the quarter ending June 2014, the value of transactions in the Interbank Foreign Exchange Market (IFEM) amounted to USD 526.9 million. During the period, the Bank sold USD 302.9 million on net terms. The Shilling depreciated to an average of TZS 1,647.68 per USD from TZS 1,624.42 per USD recorded in the preceding quarter. On annual basis, the Shilling depreciated by 2.7 percent from an average of TZS 1,603.67 per USD recorded in the quarter ending June 2013 (**Chart 2.7**).

# **3.0 PUBLIC FINANCE**

# **Government Budgetary Operations**

During the quarter ending March 2014, domestic revenue and grants amounted to TZS 2,629.6 billion, while total expenditure amounted to TZS 3,068.7 billion, resulting to a deficit after adjustment to cash of TZS 436.4 billion.

During the quarter under review, revenue collected by the Central Government amounted to TZS 2,493.4 billion or 88.4 percent of the target. Tax revenue amounted to TZS 2,356.5 billion or 89.5 percent of the target and accounted for 92.6 percent of total revenue. The under-performance in revenue collections is partly explained by delays in the implementation of some revenue measures and decline in prices of gold in the world market.

**Grants** disbursed amounted to TZS 85.6 billion during the quarter, against the projection of TZS 443.8 billion (**Chart 3.1**).





Chart 3.1: Government Resources for the Quarter ending March 2014

Expenditure for the third quarter of 2013/14 amounted to TZS 3,068.7 billion or 71.9 percent of budget estimate, out of which recurrent expenditure was TZS 2,424.5 billion and development expenditure was TZS 644.2 billion, equivalent to 89.9 percent and 41.0 percent of estimates, respectively (**Chart 3.2**).

## **National Debt Developments**

Tanzania's external debt stock at the end of June 2014 was USD 14,021.2 million, an increase of USD 556.1 million from the amount recorded at the end of March 2014. The increase was on account of new disbursements and accumulation of interest arrears. Out of the total external debt stock, 88.6 percent was disbursed outstanding debt (DOD) and 11.4 percent was interest arrears.

During the quarter ending June 2014, the profile of external debt by borrower category shows that Central Government debt increased by USD 462.8 million. On annual basis, the Central Government debt increased by USD 1,387.0 million. The amounts and percentage shares with respect to borrower categories are as indicated in **Table 3.1**

New loans worth USD 147.3 million were recorded during the quarter under review, all contracted by private sector. External loans contracted during the year ending June 2014 amounted to USD 955.8 million, out of which USD 430.9 million was contracted by the Government and USD 524.9 by private sector. During the quarter under review, new

disbursements to the Central Government and private sector amounted to USD 563.2 million and USD 54.9 million, respectively.

External debt payments during the quarter amounted to USD 54.5 million, out of which USD 36.2 million was principal repayments and USD 18.3 million was interest payments. Disbursements received during the year ending June 2014 amounted to USD 1,878.2 million, while payments amounted to USD 214.3 million.

The stock of domestic debt at the end of June 2014 amounted to TZS 6,535.4 billion, an increase of TZS 41.0 billion over the amount recorded at the end of March 2014. On annual basis, domestic debt stock increased by TZS 895.1 billion from TZS 5,640.3 billion recorded at the end of corresponding period in 2013. The increase was mainly on account of issuance of Government securities that outweighed maturing obligations.

In terms of instruments, Treasury bonds accounted for 73.9 percent followed by Treasury bills at 22.1 percent (**Table 3.3**).

The proportion of domestic debt owed to commercial banks was 50.5 percent while domestic debt owed to the Bank was 22.8 percent (**Chart 3.1**). The holding by the Bank was mainly in the form of long term bonds and stocks.




Chart 3.3: Percentage Share of Holding of Government Domestic Debt

During the quarter under review, the Government raised TZS 601.8 billion from domestic market, out of which TZS 350.7 billion was from Treasury bills and TZS 251.1 billion Treasury bonds. The amount that fell due for payment was TZS 652.3 billion, out of which principal amounting to TZS 348.4 billion was rolled over while principal and interest amounting to TZS 72.5 billion and TZS 231.5 billion, respectively were paid out of Government resources.

# **4.0 EXTERNAL SECTOR DEVELOPMENTS**

### **Current Account**

During the quarter ending June 2014, current account deficit narrowed marginally to USD 1,174.7 million compared to a deficit of USD 1,185.4 million recorded during the same quarter in 2013. This outturn was due to increase in exports particularly goods that rose by 21.6 percent, outweighing the impact of goods import which recorded an increase of 4.6 percent (**Table 4.1**).

#### **Exports**

Exports of goods increased to USD 1,416.8 million in the quarter ending June 2014 from USD 1,165.5 million recorded in the corresponding quarter in 2013. The increase was on

account of good performance in exports of manufactured goods, horticultural; and fish and fish products (**Table 4.2**).

#### **Imports**

The value of goods imports amounted to USD 2,607.3 million, being 4.6 percent higher compared to the level recorded in the same quarter in 2013, following increase in import of capital and consumer goods. Conversely, value of imports of intermediate goods decreased by 1.4 percent largely driven by a decline in import value of oil and fertilizers (**Table 4.3**).

#### Services and Income Account

In the quarter ending June 2014, services account recorded a net surplus of USD 52.1 million compared to USD 142.9 million recorded in the corresponding quarter in 2013, following increase in services payments. The deficit in income account widened by 23.3 percent to USD 124.9 million compared to a deficit of USD 101.3 million recorded in the corresponding quarter in 2013 (**Table 4.4**).

#### **World Commodity Prices**

The average world market prices of tea (Mombasa auction), cotton, cloves, gold and white petroleum products declined during the quarter ending June 2014 when compared with the levels recorded in the previous quarter. Meanwhile, prices for coffee, tea (average), sisal and crude oil increased (**Table 4.5**). While the price of tea (Mombasa auction) decreased mainly due to speculation of tea supply increase in Kenya, following improved weather condition, the price of tea (average) increased partly due to high demand from European and Middle East countries. The fall in price of cotton was partly on account of weak demand from China due to slowdown in economic activities, while that of cloves was influenced by expected increase in production in Madagascar. The price of sisal rose mainly due to an increase in global demand, while that of coffee was due to a rise in speculation that coffee production in Brazil and Vietnam will be low in 2014/15. The prices of crude oil rose mainly on account of supply disruption in Libya, geopolitical tensions in Ukraine and increase in demand from Asian Pacific countries. The price of gold decreased largely due to shift of preference for investment on equities.

# **5.0 THE ZANZIBAR ECONOMY**

### **The Overall Economic Performance**

Zanzibar GDP grew by 7.3 percent during the quarter ending March 2014, from 6.8 percent in the corresponding period in 2013. This development was mainly driven by good performance in hotel and restaurants as well as transport and communication activities. Hotels and restaurant grew by 19.6 percent, compared to 5.9 percent registered in the quarter ending March 2013, mainly due to the rise in the number of tourists. The number of tourists increased to 81,499 from 54,276 recorded during the quarter ending March 2013.

#### **Sectoral Performance**

#### **Procurement of Major Export Crops**

During the quarter ending June 2014, procurement of cloves was 82.4 tonnes compared to 41.3 tonnes procured in the corresponding quarter in 2013, on account of favorable weather condition and cyclical nature of the crop. Similarly, seaweed procurement was 3,363.8 tonnes compared to 1,424.5 tonnes recorded during the corresponding quarter in 2013, due to increase in world market prices (**Chart 5.1**).




Chart 5.1: Zanzibar Quarterly Procurement of Major Export Crops

#### **Manufacturing Activity**

During the quarter, production of soft drinks, mineral water, juice, noodles and wheat flour increased compared to the corresponding quarter in 2013 (**Table 5.1**).

#### **Inflation Developments**

The headline inflation averaged at 6.8 percent in the quarter ending June 2014, compared to 4.8 percent recorded in the corresponding quarter in 2013. The increase in inflation was largely driven by the prices of fish and banana; and items under communications, education, recreation and culture subgroups. Food inflation rose to an average of 6.1 percent from 2.8 percent, while non-food inflation increased to 7.7 percent from 6.8 percent (**Table 5.2**).



## **Government Budgetary Operations**

During the quarter ending June 2014, Government budgetary operations registered a deficit of TZS 13.5 billion after grants and adjustment to cash. Total resources amounted to TZS 103.7 billion, out of which TZS 88.1 billion were sourced domestically and the balance was grants. Tax revenue amounted to TZS 78.9 billion, or 5.7 percent above the target, while non- tax revenue was above the target by 71.0 percent. Total grants disbursed during the period amounted to TZS 15.7 billion, above the estimated amount for the period by 26.5 percent. **Chart 5.2** summarizes revenue collections by source.





During the quarter under review, tax on imports accounted for the largest share of government revenue, followed by VAT and excise duties (local) and other taxes (**Chart 5.3**).





Chart 5.3: Zanzibar Government Revenue Collection by Source - Percentage Shares for the Quarter ending June 2014

Government expenditure during the quarter under review amounted to TZS 106.4 billion, out of which TZS 75.8 billion was recurrent expenditure and the balance was development expenditure (**Chart 5.4**). Development expenditure was below the estimates for the quarter by 61.5 percent, mainly on account of delayed disbursement of funds by donors for development projects.

# **Debt Developments**

**Total debt** amounted to TZS 299.3 billion at the end of June 2014, compared with TZS 297.3 billion recorded at the end of March 2014. **External debt stock** was USD 129.8 million compared to USD 129.9 million registered at the end of March 2014. Debt guaranteed by the Union Government accounted for 87.9 percent of the total external debt stock and the balance was non-guaranteed debt. Debt due to multilateral creditors was dominant, followed by bilateral creditors (**Chart 5.5**).




Chart 5.5: Zanzibar External Debt by Creditors as at the end of June 2014





The **stock of domestic debt** increased to TZS 85.1 billion at the end of June 2014, from TZS 83.1 billion recorded at the end of the preceding quarter. The increase was mainly due to gratuity claims on government owed by pensioners coupled with suppliers' claims. **Chart 5.6** shows composition of domestic debt by creditor category.

#### Imports

During the period under review, imports of goods and services decreased by 39.9 percent to USD 60.4 million, compared with USD 100.5 million compared to levels recorded in the quarter ending March 2014. Goods imports decreased to USD 43.7 million from USD 83.5 million, while service payments decreased to USD 16.6 million compared with USD 17.0 million in the previous quarter. All categories of goods import declined except for intermediate goods (**Tables 5.9 and 5.10**).

#### Services and Income Account

Services account registered a surplus of USD 14.6 million in the quarter under review, lower than a surplus of USD 21.8 million recorded in the quarter ending March 2014. This was mainly on account of decrease in receipts from tourism related activities (**Table 5.10**).

# **6.0 ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENTS IN THE EAC AND SADC**

During the quarter ending June 2014, the average inflation rate in the East African Community declined to 5.0 percent from 5.8 percent registered in the preceding quarter. With the exception of Tanzania and Kenya, inflation in other partner states declined largely driven by the fall in prices of food, transport and housing. The inflation rate in Tanzania and Kenya rose mainly on account of increase in prices of some food, energy and fuels (**Table 6.1**). All East African partner states recorded single digit inflation during the period under review. However, only Rwanda and Burundi attained the agreed convergence criteria of inflation rate of not more than 5.0 percent.

The average inflation rate in the SADC region remained unchanged at 6.2 percent as recorded in the previous quarter (**Table 6.1**). With the exception of Angola, Malawi, Mauritius, and Seychelles inflation rate in the other SADC countries decreased. The easing in inflation rates in Angola, Malawi, Mauritius and Seychelles was mainly on account of the decrease in the prices of food, housing and electricity. Moreover, the tightening of monetary policy contributed to the decrease in inflation in Malawi. Zimbabwe continued to register a deflation which is largely associated with liquidity problems. The rise in inflation in Lesotho, Mozambique, Namibia, Swaziland and Zambia was mainly explained by the increase in the prices of food and transport. Likewise, in South Africa the inflation rate increased largely on account of weak rand, high wage settlements, rising utilities and food costs. Only Botswana, Mauritius, Mozambique, Seychelles and Zimbabwe were the SADC member countries that managed to achieve the agreed convergence criteria of the inflation rate of less than 5.0 percent.

# 8.0 GLOSSARY

### **Average Inflation Rate**

Inflation is defined as the rate at which the average level of domestic prices is increasing over a period of time.

### **Currency in Circulation outside Banks**

Notes and coin accepted as legal tender in the domestic economy, excluding amounts held by the banking system.

### **Bank Rate**

The Central Bank Rate which is determined by the Monetary Policy Committee for signalling the direction of the monetary policy.

### **Discount Rate**

The interest rate Bank of Tanzania charges on loans it extends to banks and to the Government. It uses Bank rate as a base plus a loaded factor, which change from time to time depending on the liquidity situation in the market.

### **Exchange Rate**

The price at which one currency can be purchased with another currency, e.g. TZS per US dollar.

### **Lombard Facility**

An overnight facility introduced by the Bank on 1<sup>st</sup> December 2003 to enable commercial banks to borrow at their own discretion, by pledging of eligible government securities as collateral.

### **Lombard Rate**

The rate payable for the use of the Lombard Facility. The rate is based on the prevailing weighted average yield of 35-day T-bill, Repo (7 days) or overnight inter-bank rate whichever is higher in the market plus 20 percent.

### Money Supply, M

The sum of currency in circulation outside the banking system and deposits of residents with banks defined in various levels of aggregation. In Tanzania, three aggregates of money supply are compiled and reported, namely: narrow money (M1), broad money (M2), and extended broad money (M3).

### Narrow Money (M1)

This consists of currency in circulation outside banking system and demand deposits.

### **Broad Money (M2)**

This is equivalent to narrow money (M1) plus time (fixed) and savings deposits.

### **Extended Broad Money (M3)**

It consists of broad money (M2) plus residents' foreign currency deposits.

### **Transferable Deposits**

Comprise of all deposits that are immediately convertible into currency and directly usable for making payments by cheque, draft, giro order, direct debit/credit or other payment facility without any kind of significant restriction or penalty.

### Non-transferable Deposits

Include all claims reflecting evidence of deposit other than transferable deposits. Typical examples are saving deposits and time deposits.

### **Non-Food Inflation Rate**

This is a measure of price movements caused by factors other than food prices.

### **Repurchase Agreement (REPO)**

These are agreements to purchase/sale by the BoT government securities from/to financial institutions at agreed rate for a specified period, with an understanding that the financial institutions will repurchase/resell the securities to the BoT at the end of the period.

### **Reserve Money (M0)**

The Bank of Tanzania's liabilities in the form of: currency in circulation outside the banking system, cash held by banks in their vault and deposits of banks kept with the Bank of Tanzania in national currency. Reserve money is also referred to as base money or high powered money.

### Weighted Annualized Yields of Treasury Bills of all Maturities

This is the average yield of Treasury bills, which is weighted by the volume sold of 35-day, 91-day, 182-day, and 364-day Treasury bills, expressed in percentage per year.
