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SUMMARY OF ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENTS

Gross Domestic Product

Real GDP is estimated to have grown by 5.9 percent during 2006, compared with the growth rate of 6.9 percent attained in 2005. The slowdown in real GDP growth rate during 2006 was on account of acute drought, energy shortages, and hiked oil prices towards the end of 2005. The ongoing efforts by the government to settle the energy crisis through diversification of the sources of energy is anticipated to restore stability in energy supply and revert the economy to the earlier estimated growth level of 7.0 percent or above by the year 2007.

Inflation Developments

The annual rate of inflation during the quarter ending December 2006 increased to an average of 6.3 percent, up from an average of 5.9 percent recorded during the quarter ending September 2006. The increase in the rate of inflation was mainly driven by increased prices of food and some non-food items.

Money Supply and Credit Development

On annual basis, the Extended Broad Money Supply (M3) grew at the rate of 22.2 percent, below the growth rate of 28.6

percent recorded during the quarter ending September 2006. The annual growth rate of Broad Money Supply (M2) declined to 13.5 percent compared with the growth rate of 20.1 percent recorded during the quarter ending September 2006. Credit to the private sector grew at an annual rate of 42.3 percent, higher than the rate of 37.1 percent attained during the year ending September 2006.

Interest Rate Structure

The margin between overall lending and savings deposit rates remained unchanged from its level during the quarter ending September 2006. Both overall lending and savings deposits rates maintained their previous quarter levels of 14.1 percent and 2.6 percent respectively. During the period under review, negotiated lending rates declined slightly from the previous quarter rate of 10.8¹ percent to 10.6 percent.

External Sector

During the quarter ending December 2006, the current account registered a deficit of US\$466.9 million compared with the deficit of US\$ 319.1² million recorded during the quarter ending September 2006. The widening of the current account deficit was

largely associated with the deterioration in the services account and the decline in official transfers which contracted by 10.2 percent and 25.4 percent respectively, from the levels recorded during the quarter ending September 2006.

Exchange Rate

The Tanzanian Shilling, on average, appreciated by 0.9 percent in nominal terms against the US\$, moving from an average of TZS 1,294.3³ per US\$ during the quarter ending September 2006 to TZS 1,282.5 during the quarter ending December 2006.

Government Budgetary Operations

The overall central government budget deficit (before grants) increased to TZS 367.9 billion, from the deficit level of TZS 341.4 billion recorded during the quarter ending September 2006. The deficit was however reduced to TZS 152.1 billion after considering grants amounting to TZS 215.8 billion. Revenue collections amounted to TZS 676.8 billion, surpassing the period target of TZS 616.3 billion.

Public Debt Developments

Total national debt (domestic and external) stood at US\$ 7,188.2 million as at the end of December 2006, higher by 2.2 percent from the debt stock of US\$ 7,033.2 million recorded during the quarter ending September 2006⁴. External debt service payments amounting to US\$ 9.8 million were made during the quarter under review compared with US\$ 12.7 million made during the previous quarter.

Zanzibar Government Budgetary Operations

During the quarter ending December 2006, the Zanzibar Government budgetary operations recorded an overall deficit (before grants) of TZS 18.4 billion. The overall budget deficit was reduced to TZS 12.1 billion, after considering grants amounting to TZS 6.3 billion.

Zanzibar Trade Account

The Zanzibar Trade Account recorded a surplus of US\$ 1.0 million compared with a deficit level of US\$ 4.0 million recorded during the quarter ending September 2006. The improvement is a result of decline in imports of goods and services coupled with increased export earnings.

PART 1: ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENTS

1.0 OUTPUT AND PRICE

The Overall Economic Performance

Economic performance during 2006 will partly be affected by the impact of the droughts on agriculture (experienced in the last quarter of 2005) and on hydropower generation as well as the persistent increase in oil prices. However, given the outturn of long rains during the year and the efforts made to supplement hydropower generation, the real GDP growth of 5.9 percent projected earlier is likely to be achieved. With the anticipated good weather in 2007 and the on-going efforts by the government to resolve the energy crisis through diversification of the sources of energy, it is expected that the economy will grow at the earlier estimated real GDP growth rate of 7.0 and above.

Sectoral Performance

During the quarter ending December 2006, procurement of traditional export crops declined to 265,785.3 tons from 329,064.1 tons recorded during the corresponding period in 2005. (**Table 1.1**). The downturn is explained ostensibly by substantial decline in production of cotton and tobacco mainly on account of dry weather conditions experienced

during sowing period in the western growing areas. Production of other crops namely, cashew nuts, coffee, sisal and tea however increased on account of favorable producer prices, revival of crop estates and increase in cultivated area. Increase in the production of coffee is attributed to good weather and coffee cycles.

Recovery of gold and diamond by big miners during the quarter under review improved in relation to positions recorded in corresponding period last year. Production of gold increased to 12,190 kilograms during the quarter ending December 2006 from 11,592.6 kilograms recorded during the similar period in 2005 while that of diamonds increased slightly to 65,523.4 carats from 56,112.9 carats recorded during the quarter ending December 2005.

Food Supply Situation

The Strategic Grain Reserve (SGR) stock as at the end of December 2006, increased by 18 percent to 110,203.0 tons, from 93,051.0 tons recorded during the quarter ending December 2005. The SGR position also increased by 37.0 percent compared to 80,248.0 tons recorded during the quarter ending September 2006. (**Table 1.2**). The increase in the SGR stock was attributed to the arrival of 10,000.0 tons of maize during the quarter under review, which is part of 30,000.0 tons imported by the government. Also during the quarter under review, the SGR department purchased 15,935.0 tons of maize and 1,268.0 tons of sorghum to replenish its stock.

Inflation Developments

The quarterly year-to-year inflation rate for the period ending December 2006 stood at 6.3 percent, up from 5.9 percent recorded during the quarter ending September 2006. The increase was mainly attributed to a rise in food inflation. The figures are

also based on improved series which were released in September 2006. The new series involved a change of the base price from an annual average of the whole year (2001) to December 2001 to allow for better month-to-month comparison.

Food inflation rate increased to an average of 6.2 percent from an average of 3.5 percent recorded during the quarter ending September 2006. The increase was largely attributed to a rise in average prices of all major food items prompted by end of year festivities. Food items, which recorded average price increases include, maize, rice, cassava, bananas, fruits, meat, fish, cowpeas, groundnuts, coconuts and milk.

On the other hand, Non food-inflation declined slightly from an average of 9.4 percent recorded during the quarter ending September 2006 to an average of 6.5 percent. The outturn follows a decline in the average prices of transportation, fuel, power and water, furniture and household operations maintenance and personal health and care sub-groups. (**Table 1.3**).

2.0 MONETARY AND FINANCIAL DEVELOPMENTS


Money and Credit

During the quarter ending December 2006, the growth of monetary aggregates continued to slow down, as the extended broad money supply (M3) grew by 22.2 percent, down from the growth rate of 28.6 percent registered during the preceding quarter.

Likewise, the growth of broad money supply (M2) slowed down to 13.5 percent from 20.1 percent recorded during the quarter ending September 2006. (**Table 2.1**). The rates of growth recorded at the end of December 2006 track well with the monetary targets for 2006/07 financial year, which are set at 24.2 percent for M3 and 25.2 percent for M2.

During the quarter under review, the growth rate of net foreign assets (NFA) declined by 17.5 percentage points to 39.0 percent, from the rate of 56.5 percent recorded during the quarter ending September 2006. By contrast, the growth rate of net domestic assets (NDA) registered a smaller decline of 6.4 percent compared with the decline of 9.0 percent registered during the preceding quarter. The annual growth rate of commercial banks' credit to the private sector accelerated to 42.3 percent in December 2006, up from 37.1 percent recorded in September 2006. This was well above the projected growth rate of 37.7 percent. The performance of credit to the private sector is associated with the on going government efforts to increase availability of credit to SME's and other sectors, improvements in the business sector environment, increased number of credit worth clients, and increased competition among banks in extending loans to private businesses.



Financial Markets

Treasury Bills Market

During the quarter ending December 2006, Treasury bills worth TZS 645.3 billion were sold compared with TZS 301.0 sold during the preceding quarter. Demand for Treasury bills increased from TZS 370.6 billion recorded during the quarter ending September 2006 to TZS 1,141.1 billion (**Chart 2.2**). The substantial increase in demand for Treasury bills was largely associated with the investor's response to the upward trends in Treasury bills yields.

Treasury Bonds Market

During the quarter under review, demand for Treasury bonds stood at TZS 130.3 billion, up from TZS 70.0 billion recorded during the quarter ending September 2006. There was a shift of preference in favor of 2- and 5-year Treasury bonds, as these two maturities accounted for 73.0

percent of total bids. Out of the submitted bids, the Bank accepted bids worth TZS 72.0 billion compared to TZS 46.6 billion registered in September 2006. Despite the high demand in Treasury bonds, yields on 2-year Treasury bond increased to an average rate of 15.7 percent during the quarter under review from an average rate of 14.3 percent recorded during the preceding quarter. Those for the 5-year Treasury bond declined to an average of 16.4 percent from 17.4 percent recorded during the quarter ending September 2006. The average rates on 7- and 10- year bonds increased marginally to 17.5 percent from average rates of 17.4 percent recorded during the preceding quarter.

Inter-bank Cash Market Transactions

The volume of transactions in the inter-bank cash market during the quarter under review amounted to TZS 1,175.1 billion, compared with TZS 921.2 billion traded during the quarter ending September 2006. Overnight transactions accounted for about 75.2 percent of the total volume traded. Overnight interest rates declined to 8.2 percent, from 8.4 percent recorded during the preceding quarter thus, reflecting liquidity stability in the commercial banks.

Interest Rate Structure

The spread between lending rates and savings rates remained virtually unchanged with overall lending rates and savings deposit rates remaining at the previous

quarter levels of 16.7 percent and 2.6 percent respectively. Average negotiated lending rates to prime customers also remained unchanged at 10.8 percent as registered during the preceding quarter. (**Table 2.2**).


Foreign Exchange Market Operations

During the period under review, the volume of foreign exchange traded in the Inter-bank Foreign Exchange Market (IFEM) amounted to US\$ 279.32 million, down from the amount of US\$ 341.5 million traded during the quarter ending September 2006 (**Chart 2.3**). Bank of Tanzania made a net sale of US\$ 117.5 million, compared with US\$ 205.3 million sold during the preceding quarter.

Exchange Rate

The Tanzanian Shilling appreciated against the US\$ by an average of 0.9 percent, moving from TZS 1294.3 per US\$ during the quarter ending September 2006 to TZS 1,282.5 during the quarter ending December, 2006. However, during the quarter ending September 2006, the Shilling depreciated by 4.6 percent. (**Chart 2.3**).

3.0 PUBLIC FINANCE


Government Budgetary Operations

During the quarter ending December 2006, government budgetary operations recorded an overall deficit before grants of TZS 367.9 billion. However, after considering grants amounting to TZS 215.8 billion, the deficit was reduced to TZS 152.1 billion. Total resources amounted to TZS 892.6 billion against an expenditure amount of TZS 1,044.7 billion.

Revenue Performance

Revenue collections amounted to TZS 676.8 billion, which were above the target amount of TZS 616.3 billion for the quarter. The good outturn in revenue collections came from all major tax categories following improved tax procedures and tax administration by the Tanzania Revenue Authority (TRA). (**Chart 3.1**).

Expenditure Developments

During the period under review, government expenditure excluding amortization was within the target for the quarter of TZS 1,347.5 billion. Recurrent expenditure amounted to TZS 748.1 billion while development expenditure amounted to TZS 296.6 billion.

National Debt

The debt stock (domestic and external) as at the end of December 2006 stood at US\$ 7,188.2 million, being an increase of US\$ 155.0 million or 2.2 per cent from US\$ 7,033.2 million recorded during the preceding quarter. The increase in debt stock was mainly associated with domestic borrowing and exchange rate fluctuations. External debt amounted to US\$ 5,748.8 million or 80.0 per cent of debt stock while domestic debt amounted to US\$ 1,439.4 million, representing 20.0 per cent of total debt stock.

Multilateral Debt Relief Initiative (MDRI)

During the quarter under review, debt cancellations under the MDRI by the International Development Association and IMF amounted to US\$ 2.7 billion

and US\$ 0.3 billion respectively, which reduced the debt stock significantly.

Debt Repayment

During the second quarter of 2006/7, external debt service payments amounted to US\$ 9.8 million compared with the scheduled payment of US\$ 96.2 million during the quarter under review. Out of the amount paid, US\$ 4.6 million and US\$ 5.3 million were principal and interest

respectively. The drastic fall in the actual debt service is associated with the debt relief arising from the HIPC and MDRI, and accumulation of arrears on non-serviced debts. Total domestic debt service for the quarter amounted to TZS 277.8 billion out of which TZS 237.6 billion and TZS 40.2 billion were principal and interest payments respectively. Principal payments were rolled over while interest payments were financed out of government revenue.

4.0 EXTERNAL SECTOR DEVELOPMENTS

Current Account

During the quarter ending December 2006, current account balance widened to a deficit of US\$ 466.9 million, from a deficit of US\$ 319.1 million recorded during the preceding quarter. The widening of the deficit was largely attributed to deterioration in services account and decline in official transfers. The decline in the services account was attributed to the decline in travel receipts following the end of the tourism peak season (July-September). The decline in official transfers was due to the slowdown in donor inflows in line with donor frontloading arrangements whereby a big chunk of disbursements are made during the first quarter of the financial year. (**Table 4.1**).

Exports

During the quarter ending December 2006, Tanzania exported goods worth US\$ 471.6 million, being 14.9 percent more than amount exported during the previous quarter. Much of the increase was contributed by exports of traditional crops especially cashewnut, coffee and cotton due to the fact that the review quarter is an export season for most of these crops. Similarly, non traditional exports increased by 5.7 percent between the end of September 2006 and the end of December 2006, as a result of increased exports of manufactured goods, fish fillets and other exports.

Imports

During the quarter under review, import of goods (f.o.b) increased by 10.3 percent to US\$ 1,088.8 million, from the amount of US\$ 987.2 million imported during the preceding quarter. The rise in imports was largely due to increased importation of intermediate and consumer goods. Intermediate goods imports went up by 20.1 percent to US\$ 473.6 million due to the rise in importation of oil and industrial raw materials. (**Table 4.2**). The surge in oil imports was largely on account of increased import volume of 636,862.0 tons compared with 428,948.0 tons imported during the preceding quarter.

Services and Income Account

During the quarter ending December 2006, the services account (net) declined by 69.2 percent to a surplus of US\$ 19.8 million. The decline was due to the fall in travel (tourism) receipts following the end of the tourism season which is between July-September. In addition, there was a slight increase in service payments related to other business and government services. The income account (net) recorded a deficit level of US\$ 36.3 million compared with the deficit of US\$ 36.7 million registered during the preceding quarter. (**Table 4.3**).

World Market Prices

During the quarter ending December 2006, prices of coffee (Arabica) and (Robusta) increased by 6.3 percent and 10.8 percent to US\$ 2.7 per kg and US\$ 1.7 per kg, respectively. The increase in coffee prices was on account of concerns of the decline in supply of the commodity in the world market resulting from the biennial cycle effects of the Brazilian coffee during the 2007/08 crop season and the unfavorable weather conditions in Vietnam.

Conversely, the prices of tea (Mombasa Auction) and (Average price) declined by 15.7 percent and 7.1 percent per kg, respectively, owing to improvements in weather condition in Kenya, Sri Lanka and India. Meanwhile, prices of sisal and cotton ("A Index") remained stable at US\$ 885.0 per metric ton and US\$ 1.3 per kg, respectively. Prices of cotton "Memphis" declined by 4.4 percent per kg. Similarly, the prices of cloves dropped by 37.0 percent to US\$ 2,775.0 per metric ton from US\$ 4,407.5 per metric ton following a decline in demand from kretek cigarettes manufacturers in Indonesia

During the period under review, the prices of crude oil (average of U.K. Brent, Dubai, and West Texas Intl.) and Dubai (f. o. b.) declined by 14.2 percent and 13.0 percent per barrel respectively. Likewise, the price of white petroleum products declined by 15.5 percent per ton with premium

gasoline declining by 22.5 percent per ton. (**Table 4.4**). The decline in oil prices was largely attributed to the improvement

in weather conditions in the United States that reduced the demand for heating fuel. Prices of gold also declined slightly by 1.1 percent per troy ounce.

5.0 THE ZANZIBAR ECONOMY

Budgetary Operations

During the quarter ending December 2006, the Zanzibar Government budgetary operations recorded an overall deficit (before grants) of TZS 18.4 billion. After considering grants amounting to TZS 6.3 billion, the overall budget deficit was reduced to TZS 12.1 billion. Total resources amounted to TZS 28.7 billion, against an expenditure amount of TZS 40.8 billion.


Government Revenue

During the quarter ending December 2006, government revenue amounted to TZS 22.4 billion compared with TZS 21.1 billion recorded during the preceding quarter, and it was very close to the revenue target for the quarter of TZS 22.6 billion.

Performance by revenue category reveals that tax collections amounted to TZS 21.3 billion compared to target of TZS 21.0 billion. Non-tax revenue amounted to TZS 1.1 billion below the target amount for the quarter of TZS 1.7 billion. Tax on imports amounted to TZS 4.6 billion, which was slightly below the target for the quarter of TZS 4.7 billion. VAT and Excise Duties amounted to TZS 7.9 billion, which were slightly above the target for the quarter of

TZS 7.6 billion. Income tax amounted to TZS 2.6 billion, slightly missing the target for the quarter of TZS 2.7 billion while other taxes amounted to TZS 6.2 billion which was above the estimated amount for the quarter of TZS 5.9 billion. (**Chart 5.1).**

Government Expenditure


During the quarter ending December 2006, total government expenditure amounted to TZS 40.8 billion which was below the target for the quarter of TZS 41.5 billion. The decline in expenditure was largely attributed to adherence of cash-budget system and insufficient local counter part funds for development expenditure.

Recurrent expenditure amounted to TZS 26.2 billion, accounting for 64.3 percent of total expenditure. Wages and salaries amounted to TZS 11.2 billion or 42.6

percent of total recurrent expenditure. Other expenditures amounted to TZS 15.0 billion, almost in line with the estimate of TZS 14.9 billion.

Development expenditure amounted to TZS 14.6 billion which was below the target for the quarter of TZS 15.3 billion. Local contribution amounted to TZS 2.6 billion compared with a target of TZS 3.8 billion, while donor funds amounted to TZS 11.9 billion, slightly exceeding the target of TZS 11.5 billion. (**Chart 5.2**).

Debt Developments

Public Debt

During the quarter ending December 2006, total debt stock (domestic and external) stood at TZS 204.4 billion equivalent of US\$ 162.0 million which was above the debt stock of TZS 192.2 billion or US\$ 151.0 million recorded during the preceding quarter. External debt stood at TZS 129.8 billion accounting for 63.5 percent of the total debt stock while domestic debt stood at TZS 74.6 billion and accounted for 36.5

percent of the total debt stock.


Domestic Debt

During the quarter ending December 2006, domestic debt declined to TZS 74.6 billion from the amount of TZS 78.5 billion registered during preceding quarter. The decline was attributed to the redemption of maturing government securities and payment of claims due to retirees and suppliers of good/services to the government.

Domestic Debt By Creditor

An analysis of the profile of domestic debt by creditor reveals that ‘Other creditors’ (domestic suppliers and pensioners) remained the major creditors to the government with claims amounting to TZS 42.3 billion or 56.7 percent of total domestic debt. The Union Government debt stood at TZS 13.6 billion or 18.2 percent of total domestic debt. Zanzibar Social Security Fund (ZSSF) and Zanzibar State Trading Corporation (ZSTC) debts amounted to TZS 5.9 billion and TZS 5.6 billion accounting for 7.9 percent and 7.5 percent of total domestic debt, respectively. Zanzibar Port Company (ZPC) debt stood at TZS 3.9 billion, or 5.3 percent of total domestic debt, while the Peoples’ Bank of Zanzibar (PBZ) debt amounted to TZS 3.2 billion, or 4.3 percent of total domestic debt. Domestic Debt by Instruments

The profile of domestic debt by instruments reveals that Government loans remained prominent at TZS 21.5 billion, equivalent to 28.8 percent of total domestic debt. Treasury bonds amounted to TZS 19.5 billion or 26.2 percent of total domestic debt. Other debt instruments (suppliers' credits and pensioners' claims) amounted to TZS 18.5 billion, accounting for 24.8 percent of total domestic debt. Government stocks and Treasury bills amounted to TZS 9.9 billion and TZS 5.1 billion, accounting for 13.3 percent and 6.9 percent of total domestic debt respectively (Table 5.1).

Domestic debt by maturity

Further analysis of the domestic debt shows that during the quarter ending December 2006, debts maturing in less than a year amounted to TZS 13.9 billion, accounting for 18.7 percent of total domestic debt. Debts with maturities of between 2-5 years amounted to TZS 15.7 billion accounting for 21.1 percent of total domestic debt. Debts with undermined maturity (gratuity, pension and domestic suppliers' claims) amounted to TZS 44.9 billion, or 60.2 percent of the total domestic debt (Table 5.2).


External Debt

As at the end of December 2006, the Zanzibar external debt stood at US\$ 102.9 billion equivalent of TZS 129.8 billion, up from US\$ 89.3 million equivalent of TZS 113.7 billion recorded during the preceding quarter. The increase in external debt was due to new borrowings from multilateral sources (ADB and IDA).

External Debt by Creditor Category

During the quarter ending December 2006, debts due to multilateral creditors amounted to US\$ 72.3 million or 70.3 percent of total external debt. Bilateral creditors claims amounted to US\$ 3.7 million, accounting for 3.6 percent of total external debt. Commercial and Export Credits amounted to US\$ 14.7 million and US\$ 12.2 million, or 14.3 percent and 11.8 percent of total external debt respectively (**Chart 5.4**).

External Debt by Maturity

The profile of external debt by maturity reveals that debts with maturity of above 20 years continued to be dominant amounting to US\$ 66.4 million or 64.6 percent of total external debt. Debts with maturity of between 10 and 20 years amounted to US\$ 6.9 million, accounting for 6.7 percent of total external debt. Debts with maturity of between 5 and 10 years amounted to US\$ 29.6 million or 28.7 percent of total external debt (**Table 5.3**).



External Debt Disbursements by Use of Funds

A classification of external debt by use of funds shows that Transport and Telecommunications sectors received the largest share of US\$ 29.3 million, or 28.4 percent of total external debt. Energy sector was the second which received US\$ 20.0 million or 19.5 percent of total external debt. Social Welfare and Education sectors received US\$ 15.5 million or 15.1 percent. Finance & Insurance sector received US\$ 14.7 million or 14.3 percent of total external debt. Agriculture sector received US\$ 12.5 million or 12.2 percent of total external debt. Industries and “Other” sectors were the least recipients, absorbing only US\$ 0.5 million and US\$ 10.3 million, being 0.5 percent and 10.0 percent of total external debt respectively (**Chart 5.5**).

Foreign Trade Developments

Current Account

During the quarter ending December 2006, the Zanzibar current account balance registered a surplus of US\$ 6.6 million compared with a surplus of US\$ 15.1 million during the preceding quarter. The decline was mainly attributed to a significant decline in current transfers.

On year to year basis, the current account balance registered a surplus of US\$ 6.6 million, down from the surplus of US\$ 7.4 million recorded during the corresponding period in 2005 (**Table 5.4**).

Exports

During quarter under review, total exports (f.o.b) increased from US\$ 1.4 million registered during the preceding quarter to US\$ 7.5 million. The increase was associated with an increase in traditional exports which rose from almost zero to US\$ 5.7 million. Non-traditional exports also increased from US\$ 1.4 million registered during the quarter ending September 2006 to US\$ 1.8 million (**Table 5.5**).

Imports

During the quarter under review, total goods imports (c.i.f.) went up to US\$ 18.7 million from US\$ 15.9 million registered during the quarter ending September 2006 mainly on account of increased imports of consumer and capital goods. Consumer goods imports increased to US\$ 4.7 million from US\$ 3.5 million. Capital goods imports increased to US\$ 8.6 million from US\$ 7.6 million largely

due to increased imports of machinery, building and construction materials. Intermediate goods imports went up to US\$ 5.3 million from US\$ 4.8 million mainly due to the increase in the oil import bill from US\$ 3.0 million recorded during the quarter ending September 2006, to US\$ 3.6 million (**Table 5.6**).

Service and Income Account

During the quarter ending December 2006, the services and income account (net) recorded a surplus of US\$ 10.6 million compared with the surplus of US\$ 9.2 million recorded during the preceding quarter. The improvement was largely associated with a decline in foreign payments relative to foreign receipts. Foreign payments declined to US\$ 12.3 million from US\$ 17.6 million while foreign receipts declined to US\$ 22.8 million from US\$ 26.7 million recorded during the preceding quarter (**Table 5.7**).

6.0 ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENTS IN EAC AND SADC COUNTRIES

The East Africa Community (EAC) Countries

The three EAC member states are estimated to have registered an average real GDP growth rate of 5.9 percent during 2006 compared with average growth rate of 6.1 percent attained during 2005. The slowdown in GDP growth was mainly attributable to the acute droughts and energy shortages experienced at the end of 2005. The average real growth rate of 5.9 percent is however above the Sub-Saharan Africa's estimated average growth rate of 5.4 percent for the year. The on-going initiatives to resolve the energy crisis through diversification of energy sources in the region, is expected to restore stability in energy supply and accelerated economic growth.

During the quarter ending December 2006, the average inflation rate in the East African Community (EAC) increased to 10.3 percent from an average of 8.0 percent recorded during the preceding quarter. All the three countries recorded increases in inflation rates, with Tanzania registering the lowest although its inflation rate increased to 6.3 percent from 5.9 percent recorded during the preceding quarter. The increase was mainly generated from

the increase in the prices of food items. In Kenya and Uganda, the inflation rates reached the levels of 15.3 percent and 9.2 percent respectively, mainly driven by the increase in prices of food, fuel, merchandise and services (**Table 6**).

The Southern Africa Development Co operation (SADC) Countries

Annual average GDP growth rate of 5.7 percent is projected for the SADC region during 2006 (excluding Zimbabwe), higher than the growth rate of 5.5 percent recorded in 2005. As in 2005, Angola is projected to be the fastest growing economy in the region and in Sub-Saharan African as a whole during 2006 mainly on account of expansion of oil production. Other countries in the region that are expected to perform relatively well include Malawi and Mozambique. The rest of the SADC countries are expecting real GDP growth rates of below the targets set in the macroeconomic convergence program of 7.0 percent. In Sub-Saharan Africa, growth is expected to accelerate to 5.9 percent during 2006.

During the quarter ending December 2006, the SADC region (excluding Zimbabwe) recorded average inflation

rates of 7.0 percent, compared with the rate of 6.6 percent recorded during the preceding quarter. This trend is in line with the goal of attaining a single digit inflation envisaged in the macroeconomic

convergence programme for the region (**Table 6**). Zimbabwe's rate of inflation has remained above 1,000 percent during the entire period under review.

8.0 GLOSSARY

Average Inflation Rate

This is calculated as the average of the inflation rates during the fiscal year or the calendar year

Currency in Circulation Outside Banks

Notes and coins accepted as legal tender in the domestic economy, excluding amounts held by the banking system.

Discount Rate

The rate of interest the Bank of Tanzania charges on Loans it extends to Deposit Money Banks and government overdraft. It is derived from the weighted average yield of Treasury bills of all maturities plus five-percentage points

Exchange Rate

This is the price at which one currency can be purchased with another currency, e.g. TZS per US dollar.

Lombard Facility

The Bank introduced Lombard facility on 1st December 2003, as an overnight facility to enable commercial banks to borrow at their own discretion, through pledging of eligible government securities as collateral.

Lombard Rate

This is the rate payable for the use of the Lombard Facility, which is also used as signaling mechanism for the Bank of Tanzania's monetary policy stance. The rate is based on prevailing discount rate, REPO or inter-bank rates, depending on whichever is higher.

Money Supply, M

The sum of currency in circulation outside banks and deposits of Depository Corporations. They are defined in various concepts in the narrower and broader sense, i.e., narrow money (M1), broad money (M2), and extended broad money (M3).

M1, Narrow Money,

Consists of currency in circulation outside banks and demand deposits.

M2, Broad Money

Its equivalent to narrow money (M1) plus time deposits and savings deposits.

M3, Extended Broad Money

Consists of broad money (M2) plus foreign currency deposits.

Nominal Exchange Rate

It is the price at which actual transactions in foreign exchange markets occur

Non-Food or Underlying Inflation Rate

This is a measure of price movements caused by factors other than food prices. It is an important measure, which provides better indication of the effectiveness of monetary policy on inflation since price movements in these items are caused largely by monetary policy.

Repurchase Agreement (REPO)

These are agreements to purchase/sale by the BoT government securities from/to financial institutions at agreed rate for a specified period, with an understanding that the financial institutions will repurchase/resell the securities to the BoT at the end of the period.

Reserve Money (M0)

The Central Bank's liabilities in the form of: (1) currency in circulation outside the Bank of Tanzania and (2) deposit money banks' deposits with the BoT are referred to as Base money, or reserve money.

Seasonally Adjusted Indicators

Seasonal movements or seasonal variations, refer to identical, or almost identical, patterns, which a time series appears to follow during corresponding months (quarters) of successive years. Such movements are due to recurring events, which take place annually, e.g. the harvest season. Seasonally adjusted indicators show the impact of non-seasonal influences on a time series.

Weighted Annualised Yields of Treasury Bills

This is the average yield of Treasury bills, which is weighted by the volume sold of 91-day, 182-day, and 364-day Treasury bills, expressed in percentage per year.

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
