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SUMMARY OF ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENTS

Gross Domestic Product

Provisional estimates suggest that real GDP growth rate for 2006 is likely to be in the level of 5.8 percent, lower than 7.2 percent previously projected. The slowdown in the growth of the real GDP is associated with the drought conditions experienced during the last quarter of 2005 which impacted adversely on agriculture and hydroelectric power generation. The persistent increase in oil prices is also expected to affect the performance of the economy.

Inflation Developments

The annual rate of inflation during the quarter under review increased to an average of 7.1 percent, up from an average of 5.9 percent recorded during the quarter ending March 2006. The upward pressure on inflation emanates from the persistent increase in oil prices, high food prices and high costs of power generation.

Money Supply and Credit Development

Extended Broad Money Supply (M3) grew at the rate of 31.6 percent, slightly above the growth rate of 31.5 percent recorded during the quarter ending March 2006. Broad Money Supply (M2) grew at the rate of 24.5 percent compared with the growth rate of 28.2 percent recorded during the quarter ending March 2006. Credit to the private sector grew at an annual rate of

35.9 percent, higher than the rate of 33.5 percent attained during the quarter ending March 2006.

Interest Rate Structure

The margin between overall lending and savings deposit rates narrowed by 0.9 percentage points to 12.9 percent, from 12.0 percent recorded during the quarter ending March 2006. The overall lending rates increased from 14.6 percent in March 2006 to 15.4 percent as at the end of June 2006, while lending rates to prime customers slightly declined from 11.6 percent to 11.2 percent.

External Sector

During the quarter ending June 2006, the current account registered a deficit of US\$ 495.7 million, compared with the deficit of US\$ 332.6 million recorded during the quarter ending March 2006. The widening of the current account deficit was largely on account of a decline in exports of goods and services explained by the seasonality in both the traditional exports and the travel (tourism) activities.

Exchange Rate

The Tanzanian shilling on average depreciated by 3.9 percent in nominal terms against the US Dollar, moving from an average of TZS 1,193.9 per US dollar

as at the end of March 2006 to an average of TZS 1,241.1 per US Dollar during the quarter ending June 2006.

Government Budgetary Operations

The overall central government budget deficit (before grants) increased to TZS 394.3 billion, from a deficit of TZS 202.7 billion recorded during the quarter ending March 2006. After considering grants, the deficit was reduced to TZS 253.1 billion. Revenue collections exceeded the projected quarterly target of TZS 529.4 billion by TZS 51.1 billion.

Public Debt Developments

Total national debt (domestic and external) stood at US\$ 9,635.4 million as at the end of June 2006, higher than the debt stock of US\$ 9,451.4 million recorded during the quarter ending March 2006. External debt service payments amounting to US\$ 19.7 million were made during the quarter under review.

Zanzibar Government Budgetary Operations

During the quarter ending June 2006, Zanzibar Government budgetary operations recorded an overall deficit (before grants) of TZS 17.4 billion, compared with the deficit of TZS 14.1 billion recorded during the preceding quarter. The deficit was however reduced to TZS 16.2 billion after considering grants amounting to TZS 1.2 billion.

Zanzibar Trade Account

The Zanzibar Trade Account recorded a deficit of US\$ 12.7 million, up from a deficit level of US\$ 10.0 million recorded during the quarter ending March 2006. The widening of the deficit was attributed to a decline in export earnings coupled with an increase in the imports bill.

PART 1: ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENTS

1.0 OUTPUT AND PRICE

The Overall Economic Performance

Economic performance during 2006 will partly be affected by the impact of drought on agriculture and the availability of hydroelectric power as well as the persistent increase in oil prices. However, given the normal rainfall experienced during the long rains period (March to May) and measures undertaken by the government to address the deficit of the hydropower generation, real GDP is estimated to grow at 5.8 percent in 2006, lower than 7.2 percent previously projected.

Sectoral Performance

During the quarter ending June 2006, procurement of traditional export crops declined to 64,228.5 tons from 73,078.7 tons recorded during the corresponding period in 2005 (**Table 1.1**). The decline is explained by the dry weather conditions experienced in the southern tea growing and tobacco producing areas. However, production of sisal increased due to increased producer prices offered to farmers. There were no procurement for coffee and cashewnuts as the two commodities were off-season, while procurement of cotton was delayed until early July 2006.

During the quarter ending June 2006, gold production by big mining companies declined by 6.9 percent to 11,746.6 kilograms, from 12,622.2 kilograms recorded during the corresponding period in 2005. The decline was due to low grade of ores processed by the gold producing companies.

Food Supply Situation

During the quarter ending June 2006, the Strategic Grain Reserves (SGR) stock declined by 86 percent to 15,560 tons, from 112,823 tons recorded during the corresponding period in 2005. The decline was due to distribution of relief food by the government to areas facing food shortage in the country. However, the food supply situation in the country started to improve in June 2006 following the start of the new harvesting season.

Inflation Developments

The quarterly year to year inflation for the period ending June 2006 stood at 7.1 percent, up from 5.9 percent recorded during the quarter ending March 2006. The acceleration in inflation was a result of drought related food shortages across the country, the energy crisis and high oil prices (**Table 1.3**).



2.0 MONETARY AND FINANCIAL DEVELOPMENTS

Money and Credit

During the quarter ending June 2006, extended broad money supply (M3) grew by 31.6 percent, slightly above the growth rate of 31.5 percent registered during the preceding quarter. On other hand, the growth of broad money supply (M2) slowed down to 24.5 percent, from 28.2 percent recorded during the preceding quarter (Chart 2.1). These developments were in line with the movements in the growth rates of net foreign and domestic assets. During the quarter under review, the growth rate of net foreign assets increased by 8.4 percentage points to 34.8 percent, from the rate recorded during the quarter ending March 2006, while the growth rate of net domestic assets declined to 21.5 percent, from 34.7 percent registered in the preceding quarter.

Buttressed by increased economic activities, credit to the private sector also continued to rise during the quarter ending

June 2006. The growth in commercial bank's credit to the private sector accelerated to 35.9 percent, from 33.5 percent recorded in the preceding quarter. In absolute terms, commercial bank's credit to the private sector increased by TZS 125.4 billion and reached TZS 1,656.8 billion, from TZS 1,531.4 billion recorded during the quarter ending March 2006 (**Table 2.1**).

Financial Markets

Treasury Bills Market

During the quarter ending June 2006, Treasury bills worth TZS 474.5 billion were sold compared with TZS 566.1 billion sold during the preceding quarter. Demand for Treasury bills fell from TZS 954.8 billion, recorded during the quarter ending March 2006 to TZS 912.0 billion. The decline in demand follows a substantial decline in the share of commercial banks' participation

in the Treasury bills market from 79.2 percent, recorded during the quarter ending March 2006 to 54.7 percent.

The quarter under review witnessed an increase in private sector participation in the Treasury bills market rising to 40.8 percent, from 15.4 percent recorded during the quarter ending March 2006. The increase in private sector participation in the Treasury bills market is associated with the Bank of Tanzania's decision to reduce substantially the minimum bid amount from TZS 50.0 million to TZS 5.0 million beginning March 2006, in order to widen the circle of direct investors in the Treasury bills market. Consequently, the overall weighted average yield (WAY) for all maturities declined to 8.2 percent as at the end of June 2006, from 13.4 percent recorded at the end of March 2006 (**Chart 2.2**).

Treasury Bonds Market

During the quarter under review, demand for Treasury bonds increased as institutional investors shifted their portfolio preferences in favor of the Treasury bonds with longer

maturities. Amount offered for sale was TZS 52.0 billion while bids received were worth TZS 139.1 billion and sales amounted to 53.5 billion.

The weighted average yield (WAY) across all maturities declined, with the exception of the 5-year Treasury bond, which remained unchanged at 17.8 percent. The yields for the 2-year Treasury bond declined from 16.1 percent, recorded in March 2006 to 13.4 percent as at the end of June 2006, while those for the 7-year Treasury bond declined from 18.1 percent to 15.3 percent. The yields for the 10-year Treasury bond also declined slightly from 20.3 percent to 16.0 percent.

Inter-bank Cash Market Transactions

During the quarter under review, the volume of transactions in the inter-bank cash market amounted to TZS 943.1 billion, compared with TZS 1,043.2 billion traded during the quarter ending March 2006. Overnight transactions accounting for about 73 percent of the total volume traded. Overnight interest rates rose to 8.4 percent during the quarter ending June 2006, from 4.9 percent recorded during the preceding quarter reflecting a tight liquidity condition among commercial banks.

Interest Rate Structure

During the quarter ending June 2006, the spread between lending rates and saving rates widened by 0.9 percentage points,

reaching 12.9 percent from 12.0 percent recorded during the quarter ending March 2006. Overall lending rates rose, while interest rates for other financial instruments experienced a mixed trend. The overall weighted average lending rate went up by 0.8 percentage points from 14.6 percent in March 2006 to 15.4 percent during the quarter ending June 2006, while the average rate charged to prime borrowers declined from 11.6 percent to 11.2 percent. Amid increased competition for longer-term placements, the overall time deposits rate rose to 7.3 percent, from 5.9 percent registered during the quarter ending March 2006. The 12 months time deposit rate went up by 0.9 percentage points from 7.4 percent to 8.3 percent, while the corresponding loan rate increased slightly by 0.1 percentage points from 15.5 percent to 15.6 percent (**Table 2.2**).

Inter-bank Foreign Exchange Market


During the quarter ending June 2006, the volume traded in the Inter-bank Foreign Exchange Market (IFEM) increased by 54 percent to US\$ 311.5 million, from US\$ 202.3 million recorded during the preceding quarter. On net basis, the Bank of Tanzania sold US\$ 209.4 million,

compared with US\$ 48.3 million sold during the quarter ending March 2006. Commercial bank's participation in the market resulted in a net purchase of US\$ 224.9 million, while non-bank financial institutions made a net sale of US\$ 67.5 million.

Exchange Rate

The Tanzania shilling depreciated against the US dollar by 3.9 percent, moving from TZS 1193.9 per US\$ as at the end of March 2006 to TZS 1241.1 per US\$ as at the end of June 2006. However, during the quarter ending March 2006, the shilling depreciated by 2.9 percent (**Chart 2.3**).

3.0 PUBLIC FINANCE


Government Budgetary Operations

During the quarter ending June 2006, the government budget recorded an overall deficit before grants of TZS 394.3 billion. The deficit was however reduced to TZS 253.1 billion after considering grants amounting to TZS 141.2 billion.

Revenue Performance

During the period under review, revenue collections amounted to TZS 580.5 billion, well above the targeted amount of TZS 529.4 billion for the quarter. The good outturn in tax revenue collections particularly income taxes and taxes on imports was associated with improvement in tax administration. Specifically, the Tanzania Revenue Authority improved the tax audit procedures and techniques to facilitate close monitoring of non-filers, while concerted efforts were also made to collect tax arrears (**Chart 3.1**).

Expenditure Developments

During the period under review, government expenditure excluding amortization was within the target amount of TZS 975.0 billion for the quarter. Recurrent expenditure amounted to TZS 688.1 billion, while development expenditure amounted to TZS 286.7 billion.

National Debt

The Debt stock (domestic and external) as at the end of June 2006 stood at US\$ 9,635.4 million, being an increase of US\$ 184.0 million or 1.9 per cent from the position of the previous quarter of US\$ 9,451.4 million. The increase in debt stock was mainly due to exchange rates fluctuations, recording of disbursements on old and new loans, and accumulation of interest arrears. External debt stock,

amounted to US\$ 8,229.5 million or 85.4 percent of the total debt stock while domestic debt amounted to US\$1,405.9 million, representing 14.6 percent of the total debt stock.

Debt Relief

During the quarter under review, Tanzania received US\$ 13.8 million from multilateral creditors under the HIPC debt relief framework. As at end June 2006, cumulative debt relief realized from these multilateral creditors reached US\$ 438.2 million. (**Table 3.1**).

Tanzania is expected to receive further debt cancellation under the Multilateral Debt Relief Initiative (MDRI) from the International Development Association (IDA) and African Development Bank (ADB) although the amounts have not yet been determined. This will be in addition to the debt amount of US\$ 338.0 million cancelled by the IMF in January 2006 under the same arrangement. IDA is expected to implement debt relief under MDRI on July 1, 2006, covering debts disbursed and outstanding as at December, 31st 2003 that remained outstanding until July 2006. ADB had its MDRI implementation

date of January 2006 though the delivery is expected to be done retrospectively in September 2006.

Debt Repayment

During the quarter ending June 2006, external debt service payments amounted to US\$ 19.7 million, out of which US\$ 10.9 million was principal and US\$ 8.9 million was interest. The impact of debt relief arising from the HIPC and the MDRI, and accumulation of arrears on non-serviced debts reduced substantially the projected debt service payments for the quarter which was in the order of US\$ 100.5 million.

Total domestic debt service for the quarter under review amounted to TZS 342.2 billion, out of which TZS 290.4 billion and TZS 51.8 billion were for principal and interest respectively. Principal repayments were rolled over while interest payments were financed out of government revenue.

4.0 EXTERNAL SECTOR DEVELOPMENTS

Current Account

During the quarter ending June 2006, the current account deficit widened to US\$ 495.7 million, from a deficit of US\$ 332.6 million recorded during the preceding quarter. The widening of the deficit was attributed to the decline in exports of good and services as the result of off-season quarter for both traditional crops and travel (tourism) activities. Despite the weakening of the current account balance, the amount of donor inflows increased from US\$ 73.2 million recorded during the quarter ending March 2006 to US\$ 107.6 million. Most of the official donor inflows were directed towards implementation of the National Strategy for Growth and Reduction of Poverty related activities popularly known in Swahili acronym as MKUKUTA (**Table 4.1**).

Exports

During the quarter ending June 2006, Tanzania exported goods worth US\$ 391.4 million, being 6.0 percent less than the amount exported during the preceding quarter. This follows a decline in export volumes of most of the traditional crops. With the exception of tea, all other traditional exports recorded declines in volumes as most of them were off-season. Non-traditional exports however, increased by 5.2 percent from the preceding quarter position to US\$ 352.6 million owing mainly to good performance of minerals and manufactured goods. Exports of minerals particularly gold, continued to dominate, as they accounted for about 56.0 percent of total non-traditional exports.

Imports

During the quarter under review, goods imports increased by 20.4 percent, from US\$ 811.1 million recorded at the end of March 2006 to US\$ 976.6 million following increased imports of capital, intermediate and consumer goods. Capital goods imports went up by 12.9 percent, mainly due to the increase in importation of building and construction equipment and machinery. The increase in capital goods imports was driven by the increase in economic activities particularly in

the mining, construction, tourism and manufacturing sectors. Intermediate goods imports rose by 33.6 percent, mainly due to the increase in imports of oil and industrial raw materials. Oil imports alone increased by 36.5 percent from US\$ 228.6 million, in March 2006 to US\$ 311.9 million driven by the surge in world market prices of oil. The surge in oil prices is attributed to the increase in oil demand particularly in the USA, India and China coupled with supply constraints amid global security concerns in the Middle East. Consumer goods imports increased by 11.9 percent, from US\$ 191.7 million to US\$ 214.6 million on account of the increase in imports of both food and non-food items. Imports of food and foodstuffs which mainly comprise of cereals rose by 20 percent, from US\$ 66.6 million to US\$ 79.9 million. The increase was in response to food shortages in the country resulting from the drought conditions experienced in the country during the second half of 2005 (**Table 4.2**).

Services and Income Account

During the quarter ending June 2006, the services account (net) declined by 3.2 percent to US\$ 39.9 million from US\$ 41.2 million, mainly due to the decline in travel (tourism) receipts as it was a low tourist season. Similarly, the income account (net) deteriorated to a deficit of US\$ 41.4 million, from a deficit of US\$ 36.1 million registered in the preceding quarter mainly due to an increase in scheduled interest payments (**Table 4.3**).

World Market Prices

During the quarter ending June 2006, prices of coffee (Arabica) and (Robusta) declined slightly by 8.0 percent and 3.0 percent respectively, compared with the levels recorded in the preceding quarter. The decline in coffee prices was due to increased supply of the commodity arising from favourable weather conditions in Brazil. Prices of cotton (A- Index) and (Memphis) also went down by 7.0 percent and 3.0 percent respectively following a decline in demand for cotton by China. On the other hand, prices of cloves increased significantly by 25.0 percent,

following a huge decline in clove stocks in the world market and uncertainty on the supply of the crop from Indonesia. Prices of tea (Mombasa Auctions) and (Average price) rose by 3.0 percent and 7.2 percent respectively, due to the decline in supply of the commodities following unfavourable weather conditions in East Africa. Prices of sisal remained unchanged in line with the recommendation made by the FAO Committee in 2004 to maintain the price of East African UG fibre between US\$ 840 to US\$ 900 per ton.

During the review period, prices of crude oil (average of U.K. Brent, Dubai, and West Texas Intl.) and Dubai (f. o. b.) increased modestly by 11.9 percent and 11.8 percent per barrel respectively. Similar developments were observed in the prices of white petroleum products which recorded notable increases in prices of 17.7 percent. The increase in oil prices was largely attributed by the decline in the U.S oil inventories, coupled with uncertainties regarding oil supply from Iran and Iraq amid geo-political tension. With regard to gold prices, the same increased by 13.3 percent, partly due to increased demand as investors diversified from investing in stocks, bonds and currencies gold because of global insecurity (**Table 4.4**).

5.0 ZANZIBAR ECONOMY

Budgetary Operations

During the quarter ending June 2006, the Zanzibar Government budgetary operations on cheques issued basis, recorded an overall deficit before grants of TZS 17.4 billion. However, the deficit was reduced to TZS 16.2 billion after considering grants amounting to TZS 1.2 billion.


Government Revenue

During quarter ending June 2006, total revenue collections amounted to TZS 16.1 billion compared with TZS 19.6 billion recorded during the preceding quarter. The revenue outturn was below the target for the quarter of TZS 16.6 billion. The decline in the revenue collections was mainly explained by the reduction of taxable imports and low trading activities associated with the on going rehabilitation of the Zanzibar port and low tourism season.

Performance by revenue category reveals that, tax and non-tax revenue amounted to TZS 14.8 billion or 91.9 percent and TZS 1.3 billion or 8.1 percent of total revenue respectively. Tax on imports amounted to TZS 3.8 billion and were below the set target of TZS 4.0 billion. VAT and Excise duty (local) amounted to TZS 4.9

billion, being slightly above target of TZS 4.8 billion for the quarter. Income tax collections amounted to TZS 1.9 billion and were above the target for the quarter of TZS 1.7 billion. Other tax categories amounted to TZS 4.2 billion against target of TZS 4.7 billion (Chart 5.1).

Government Expenditure


During the quarter ending June 2006, total government expenditure amounted to TZS 33.5 billion, surpassing the target for the quarter of TZS 31.0 billion. The increase in expenditure was mainly driven by settlement of previous outstanding obligations. However the expenditure amount was below the TZS 32.8 billion spent during the previous quarter.

Recurrent expenditure amounted to TZS 22.0 billion, accounting for 65.7

percent of total expenditure. Wages and salaries accounted for the largest share of expenditure reaching TZS 11.5 billion or 52.3 percent. Other expenditures categories amounted to TZS 10.2 billion or 46.4 percent while debt servicing amounted to TZS 0.3 billion or 1.4 percent of total recurrent expenditure.

During the quarter under review, development expenditure amounted to TZS 11.5 billion, or 34.3 percent of total expenditure and was in line with the target for the quarter. The local component of development expenditure amounted to TZS 0.3 billion or 2.6 percent, while external donor funds financed a total of TZS 11.2 billion or 97.4 percent of total development expenditure (**Chart 5.2**).

Financing

During the quarter ending June 2006, the overall budget deficit was financed exclusively from non - bank sources (treasury bonds) amounting to TZS 4.0 billion and donor funds amounting to TZS 11.2 billion.

Debt Developments

During the quarter ending June 2006, total debt stock (domestic and external) stood at TZS 181.6 billion, equivalent to US\$ 144.9 million, and was below the debt stock of TZS 185.9 billion equivalent to US\$ 151.9 million recorded during the preceding quarter. The decline in debt stock was mainly attributed by the reconciliation of the Peoples Bank of Zanzibar debt as well as debt relief availed by the African Development Bank (ADB).

During the quarter ending June 2006, external debt stood at TZS 110.9 billion equivalent to US\$ 88.5 million, or 61.1 percent of the total debt. Domestic debt amounted to TZS 70.7 billion, equivalent to US\$ 56.4 million or 38.9 percent of total debt.

Domestic Debt


During the review quarter, domestic debt declined by 5.6 percent to TZS 70.7 billion from TZS 74.9 billion recorded during the quarter ending March 2006. The decline was mainly explained by the reconciliation of debts due to the Peoples Bank of Zanzibar and the payment of pensioners.

Domestic Debt By Creditor

The profile of domestic debt by creditor reveals that ‘Other creditors’ (domestic suppliers and pensioners) remained the major creditor to government with claims amounting to TZS 38.2 billion,

or 54.1 percent of total domestic debt. The Union Government debt stood at TZS 13.6 billion or 19.3 percent of total domestic debt. Zanzibar Social Security Fund (ZSSF) and Zanzibar State Trading Corporation (ZSTC) debts amounted to TZS 6.0 billion and TZS 5.6 billion, constituting 8.5 percent and 8.0 percent of total domestic debt respectively. Zanzibar Port Company (ZPC) debt stood at TZS 3.9 billion, representing 5.6 percent of total domestic debt, while the Peoples Bank of Zanzibar (PBZ) debt amounted to TZS 3.2 billion, or 4.6 percent of total domestic debt (**Chart 5.3**).

Domestic Debt by Instruments

Analysis of domestic debt by instruments indicates that Government loans remained prominent at TZS 21.5 billion or 30.4 percent of total domestic debt. Other debt instruments (suppliers' credits and pensioners claims) amounted to TZS 19.1 billion, or 27.0 percent of total domestic debt. Debts in the form of Treasury bonds and government stocks amounted to

TZS 12.8 billion and TZS 10.0 billion, representing 18.2 percent and 14.2 percent of total domestic debt respectively. Treasury bills amounted to TZS 7.2 billion, accounting for 10.2 percent of total domestic debt (**Table 5.1**).

Domestic debt by maturity

During the quarter ending June 2006, debts maturing in less than a year increased by 13.9 percent, from the previous quarter amount of TZS 15.8 billion to TZS 18.0 billion representing 25.5 percent of total domestic debt. Debts with maturity of between 1- 2 years declined by 88.9 percent, from TZS 11.7 billion recorded during the quarter ending March 2006 to TZS 1.3 billion and accounted for 1.8 percent of the total domestic debt. Debts with maturity of between 2-5 years amounted to TZS 9.1 billion, as they increased by 79.1 percent from TZS 5.1 billion recorded during the preceding quarter to TZS 9.1 billion and accounted for 12.9 percent of total domestic debt. Debts with “undetermined maturity” (gratuity, pension, and domestic suppliers’ claims) remained at the levels recorded in

the previous quarter of TZS 42.3 billion, accounting for 59.8 percent of the total domestic debt (**Table 5.2**).


External Debt

As at the end of June 2006, the Zanzibar Government external debt stood at US\$ 88.5 million, equivalent to TZS 110.9 billion, down from US\$ 90.7 million equivalent to TZS 111.1 billion recorded during the preceding quarter. The decline in the external debt was due to debt relief extended by the African Development Bank (ADB).

External Debt by Creditor Category

During the quarter ending June 2006, debts due to multilateral creditors amounted to US\$ 57.4 million, constituting 64.8 percent of total external debt. Bilateral creditors claims amounted to US\$ 4.6 million, accounting for 5.3 percent of total external debt. Commercial and export credits amounted to US\$ 14.7 million and US\$ 11.7 million and accounted for 16.7 percent and 13.2 percent of total external debt respectively (**Chart 5.4**).

External Debt by Maturity

The analysis of external debt by maturity indicates that, debts with maturity of above 20 years amounted to US\$ 51.7 million, and accounted for 58.4 percent of total external debt. Debts maturing between 5 and 10 years stood at US\$ 29.8 million or 33.7 percent of total external debt, while debts with maturity of between 10 and 20 years amounted to US\$ 7.0 million and accounted for 7.9 percent of total external debt (**Table 5.3**).



External debt Disbursements by Use of Funds

Classification of external debt by use of funds shows that as at the end of June 2006, Social Welfare and Education sectors received US\$ 25.8 million or 29.2 percent of total disbursements. Transport and Telecommunications sectors received US\$ 18.0 million or 20.3 percent while Energy received US\$ 19.0 million, being 21.5 percent of total disbursements. Finance & Insurance absorbed US\$ 14.7 million, representing 16.7 percent of total disbursements. Agriculture and Industries received US\$ 6.8 million and US\$ 0.2 million each, accounting for 7.7 percent and 0.2 percent respectively. “Other” sectors received US\$ 4.0 million, representing 4.5 percent of the total disbursements (**Chart 5.5**).

Foreign Trade Developments

Trade Balance

During the quarter ending June 2006, the Zanzibar trade balance (goods and services) deficit widened by 27.0 percent

to US\$ 12.7 million from US\$ 10.0 million recorded during the preceding quarter. The widening of the trade deficit was attributed by the decline in export earnings and an increase in imports related with construction activities. Export receipts declined to US\$ 20.2 million from US\$ 20.9 million recorded in the preceding quarter, while imports increased to US\$ 32.9 million from US\$ 30.9 million (**Table 5.4**).

Goods Account

During the quarter ending June 2006, the goods account deficit widened by 20.9 percent to US\$ 18.0 million, from a deficit of US\$ 14.9 million recorded in the preceding quarter. The deterioration in the goods account was explained by the decline in exports by 74.5 percent to US\$ 0.7 million, from US\$ 2.8 million recorded during the preceding quarter. Imports increased to US\$ 18.7 million, from US\$ 17.7 recorded during the preceding quarter (**Table 5.5**).

Exports

During quarter ending June 2006, total goods exports (fob) declined by 74.5 percent to US\$ 0.7 million, from US\$ 2.8 million recorded during the preceding quarter. The decline was largely explained by the absence of clove stocks associated with seasonality factors. Clove exports decreased to US\$ 0.03 million, from US\$ 2.21 million recorded in the preceding quarter. Seaweeds exports declined to US\$ 0.3 million, from US\$ 0.4 million registered during the preceding quarter. Manufactured goods performed relatively well, settling at US\$ 0.02 million, from US\$ 0.01 million recorded at the end of March 2006. Exports of fish & fish products increased to US\$ 0.17 million from US\$ 0.05 million. Other exports (spices, souvenirs etc) increased to US\$ 0.15 million, from US\$ 0.12 million recorded during the quarter ending March 2006. (**Table 5.6**).

Imports

Total goods imports (c.i.f.) for the quarter ending June 2006 increased to US\$ 20.6 million, from US\$ 19.4 million recorded in the preceding quarter. Capital and Consumer goods imports accounted for the largest increase. Imports of capital goods increased to US\$ 8.8 million, from US\$ 7.2 million registered in the preceding quarter. Consumer good imports recorded a slight increase to US\$ 5.4 million, from US\$ 5.1 million of previous quarter and accounted for 26.3 percent of total imports. Imports of food stuffs declined by 4.5 percent to US\$ 2.0 million, from US\$ 2.1 million registered in preceding quarter. Imports of intermediate goods which accounted for 30.5 percent of total imports declined to US\$ 6.2 million, from US\$ 7.1 million registered in the previous quarter due to the decline in oil imports (**Table 5.7**).

Service and Income Account

During the period under review, the services and income account recorded a surplus of US\$ 5.4 million compared with the surplus of US\$ 4.9 million recorded in the preceding quarter. The increase was mainly explained by an increase in net foreign receipts from US\$ 18.1 million, received during the preceding quarter to US\$ 19.5 million. The increase in foreign receipts emanated from tourism related activities mainly travel services. Foreign payments also increased to US\$ 14.2 million, from US\$ 13.2 million registered in the preceding quarter (**Table 5.8**).

6.0 ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENTS IN EAC AND SADC COUNTRIES

The EAC Countries

The EAC economies performed relatively well during 2005, compared with the previous year as the real GDP growth rates increased from an average of 4.7 percent to 5.7 percent. Tanzania recorded the highest real GDP growth rate of 6.8 percent after growing at 6.7 percent in 2004, mainly on account of growth recovery in the mining, services and construction sectors.

Inflation rates in the region slowed down during the quarter ending June 2006 to an average of 8.9 percent during the quarter ending June 2006, from an average of 10.2 percent recorded in the preceding quarter. While the rates of inflation declined in Uganda and Kenya, inflation went up in Tanzania from 5.9 percent to 7.0 percent on account of food shortages, energy crisis and the high oil prices. The decline in inflation rates in Uganda and Kenya were largely on account of declines in prices of goods and services (**Table 6.0**).

The SADC Countries

The year 2005 witnessed a slow down in economic growth rates for most of the SADC countries. On average, real GDP growth rates for the whole SADC region declined to 4.3 percent, from the average growth rate of 4.5 percent recorded in

2004. Angola however, recorded the highest real GDP growth rate in the region of 15.5 percent, mainly on account of the expansion of the oil sector coupled with an increase in oil prices in the world market. While moderate growth rates were recorded in some of the economies, the recession in the economies of Zimbabwe and Seychelles contributed to the decline in real GDP growth rate for the region. Botswana, Malawi, and Mauritius recorded declines in growth rates as a result of sharp increases in oil prices and unfavourable climatic conditions that caused a deceleration in manufacturing and agricultural outputs.

With the exception of Zimbabwe, inflation rates in other SADC countries remained modest. While inflation rates of South Africa and Seychelles remained unchanged, Zambia, Malawi, Botswana, and Angola registered declines in inflation and Mauritius, Mozambique, Namibia and Zimbabwe recorded increases in inflation with Zimbabwe's inflation rate being the highest (**Table 6.0**).

7.0 GLOSSARY

Average Inflation Rate

This is calculated as the average of the inflation rates during the fiscal year or the calendar year

Currency in Circulation Outside Banks

Notes and coin accepted as legal tender in the domestic economy, excluding amounts held by the banking system.

Discount Rate

The rate of interest the Bank of Tanzania charges on Loans it extends to Deposit Money Banks and government overdraft. It is derived from the weighted average yield of Treasury bills of all maturities plus five-percentage points

Exchange Rate

This is the price at which one currency can be purchased with another currency, e.g. TZS per US dollar.

Lombard Facility

The Bank introduced Lombard facility on 1st December 2003, as an overnight facility to enable commercial banks to borrow at their own discretion, through pledging of eligible government securities as collateral.

Lombard Rate

This is the rate payable for the use of the Lombard Facility, which is also used as signaling mechanism for the Bank of Tanzania's monetary policy stance. The rate is based on prevailing discount rate, REPO or inter-bank rates, depending on whichever is higher.

Money Supply, M

The sum of currency in circulation outside the banks and deposits of Depository Corporations, are defined in various concepts of money supply in the narrower and broader sense, i.e., narrow money (M1), broad money (M2), and extended broad money (M3).

M1, Narrow Money,

Consists of currency in circulation outside banks and demand deposits.

M2, Broad Money

Is equivalent to narrow money (M1) plus time deposits and savings deposits.

M3, Extended Broad Money

Consists of broad money (M2) plus foreign currency deposits.

Nominal Exchange Rate

It is the price at which actual transactions in foreign exchange markets occur.

Non-Food or Underlying Inflation Rate

This is a measure of price movements caused by factors other than food prices. It is an important measure, which provides better indication of the effectiveness of monetary policy on inflation since price movements in these items are caused largely by monetary policy.

Repurchase Agreement (REPO)

These are agreements to purchase/sale by the BoT government securities from/to financial institutions at agreed rate for a specified period, with an understanding that the financial institutions will repurchase/resell the securities to the BoT at the end of the period.

Reserve Money (M0)

The Central Bank's liabilities in the form of: (1) currency in circulation outside the Bank of Tanzania and (2) deposit money banks' deposits with the BoT are referred to as Base money, or reserve money.

Seasonally Adjusted Indicators

Seasonal movements or seasonal variations, refer to identical, or almost identical, patterns, which a time series appears to follow during corresponding months (quarters) of successive years. Such movements are due to recurring events, which take place annually, e.g. the harvest season. Seasonally adjusted indicators show the impact of non-seasonal influences on a time series.

Weighted Annualised Yields of Treasury Bills

This is the average yield of Treasury bills, which is weighted by the volume sold of 91-day, 182-day, and 364-day Treasury bills, expressed in percentage per year.
